

Review Panel

Applications will undergo internal review process to check feasibility and eligibility criteria.

Projects meeting these criteria will then be shared online for the public to vote on.

Energy: DCC Property SRV Energy Team Leader and Home Energy Scotland.

Transport: DCC Sustainable Transport Team Leader and Cycling Scotland.

Waste: DCC Senior Waste Policy Officer and Zero Waste Scotland

Resilience: DCC Greenspace Team Leader and University of Dundee Botanic Garden's Curator.

Building Capacity: DCC Community Benefits Officer, DCAN, and Community Planning Partnership representative.



CRF Funding Community Choices Help

Dundee Climate Fund



The Dundee Climate Fund has been set up to support community-led climate change projects. It's based on a model called Community Choices where citizens will decide how to spend a budget that supports the delivery of the city's Climate Action Plan.

The Dundee Climate Fund has a total of £750,000, where £250,000 is revenue and £500,000 is capital funding.

The Dundee Climate Fund will support projects that relate to one or more of the following themes:



• **Energy:** reducing consumption, promoting energy efficiency, use of renewables.



• **Transport:** encouraging active travel, decarbonising transport.



· Waste: reducing waste, recycling, reusing resources.



· Resilience: improving greenspaces, biodiversity, local food growing.



• **Community Engagement:** increasing public awareness, engaging communities and young people in climate change.

Public vote

- Dundee citizens will determine which projects the funding will be awarded to.
- All voters will distribute the entire budget across applications using the *shopping basket* procedure.
 - Shopping basket procedure: Voter chooses how to spend entire round's budget across projects.
